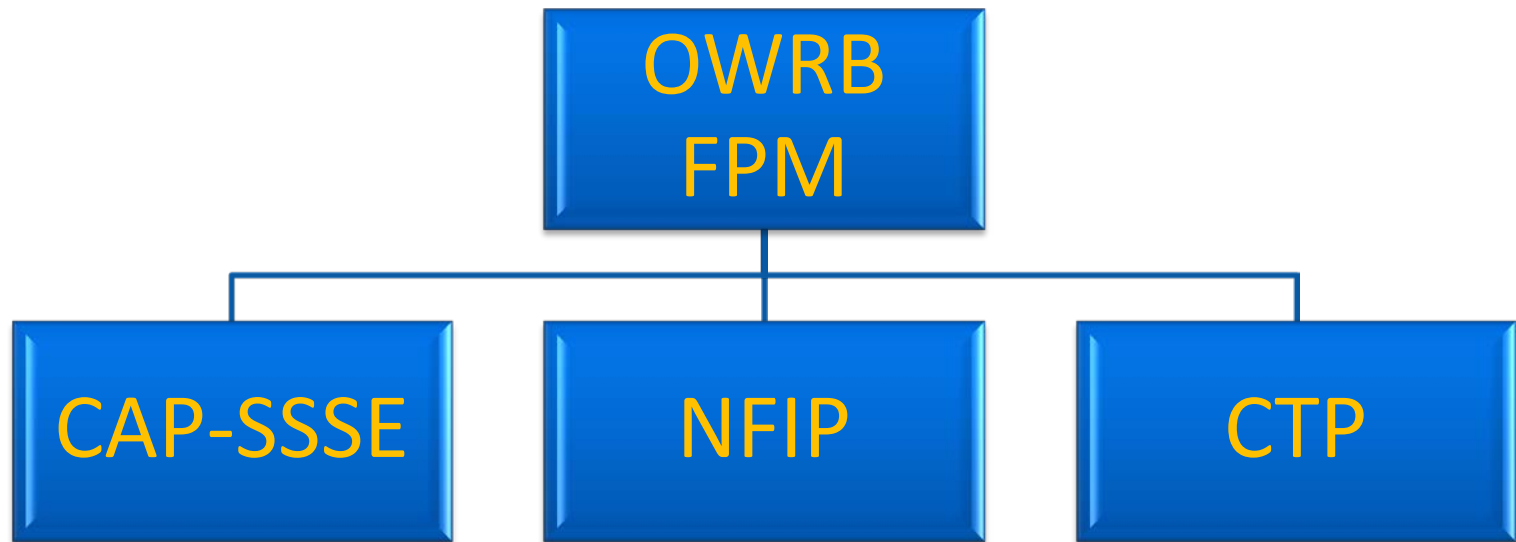

NFIP

The NFIP was created by Congress in 1968, offering non-structural approaches to reduce flood damage.

- A voluntary enrollment program.
- Requires local governments to adopt and enforce floodplain regulations before flood insurance can be obtained in their community.
- The local regulations must meet or exceed the minimum NFIP requirements.
- Under NFIP regulations, 44 CFR 60.3 general standards are outlined which are required of all participating communities.

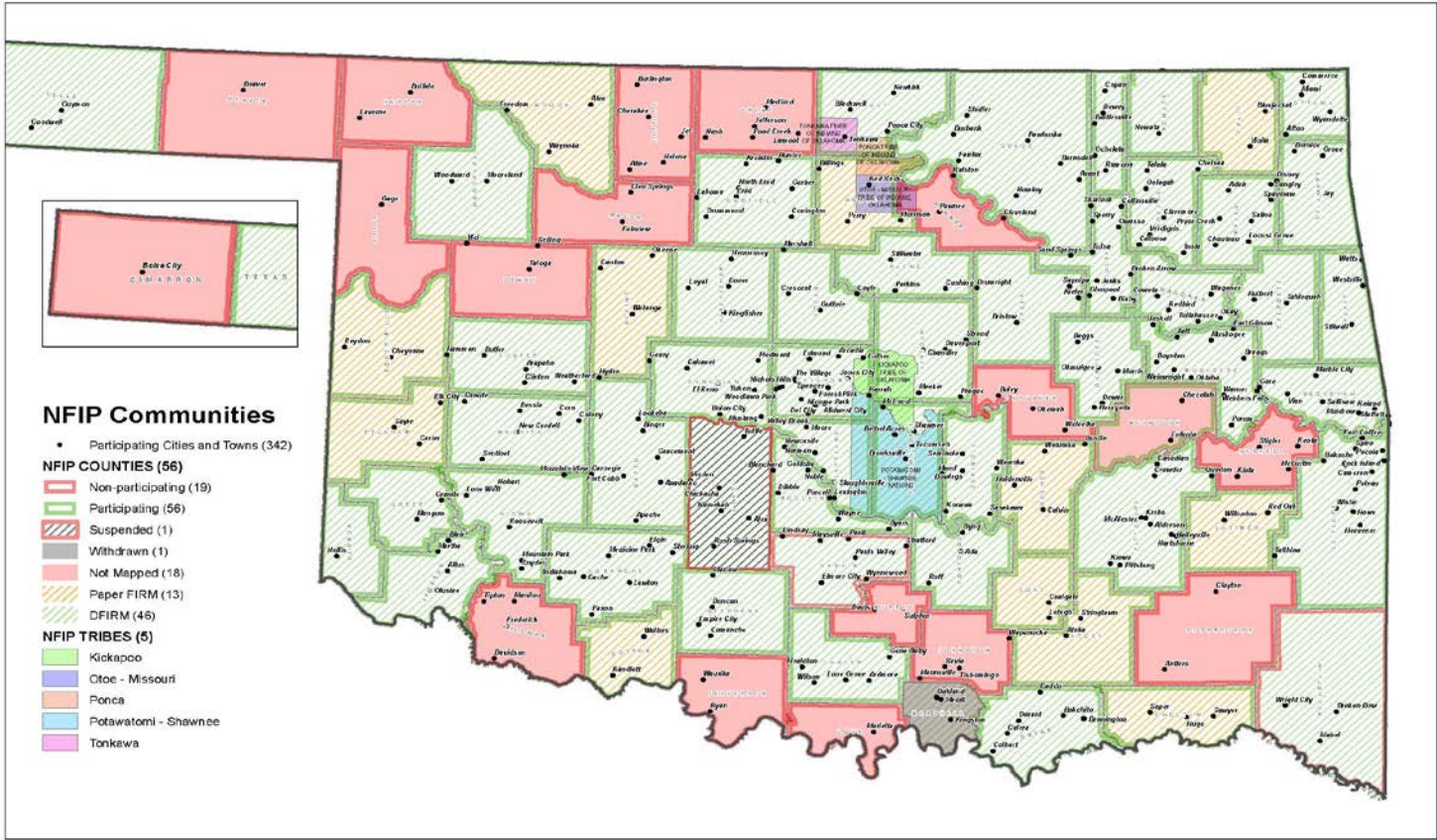
NFIP

NFIP coverage is available to all owners of eligible property located within a participating community.

You do not have to be in the special flood hazard area (SFHA). More than 25% of all claims are from properties outside the SFHA.



NFIP Participation



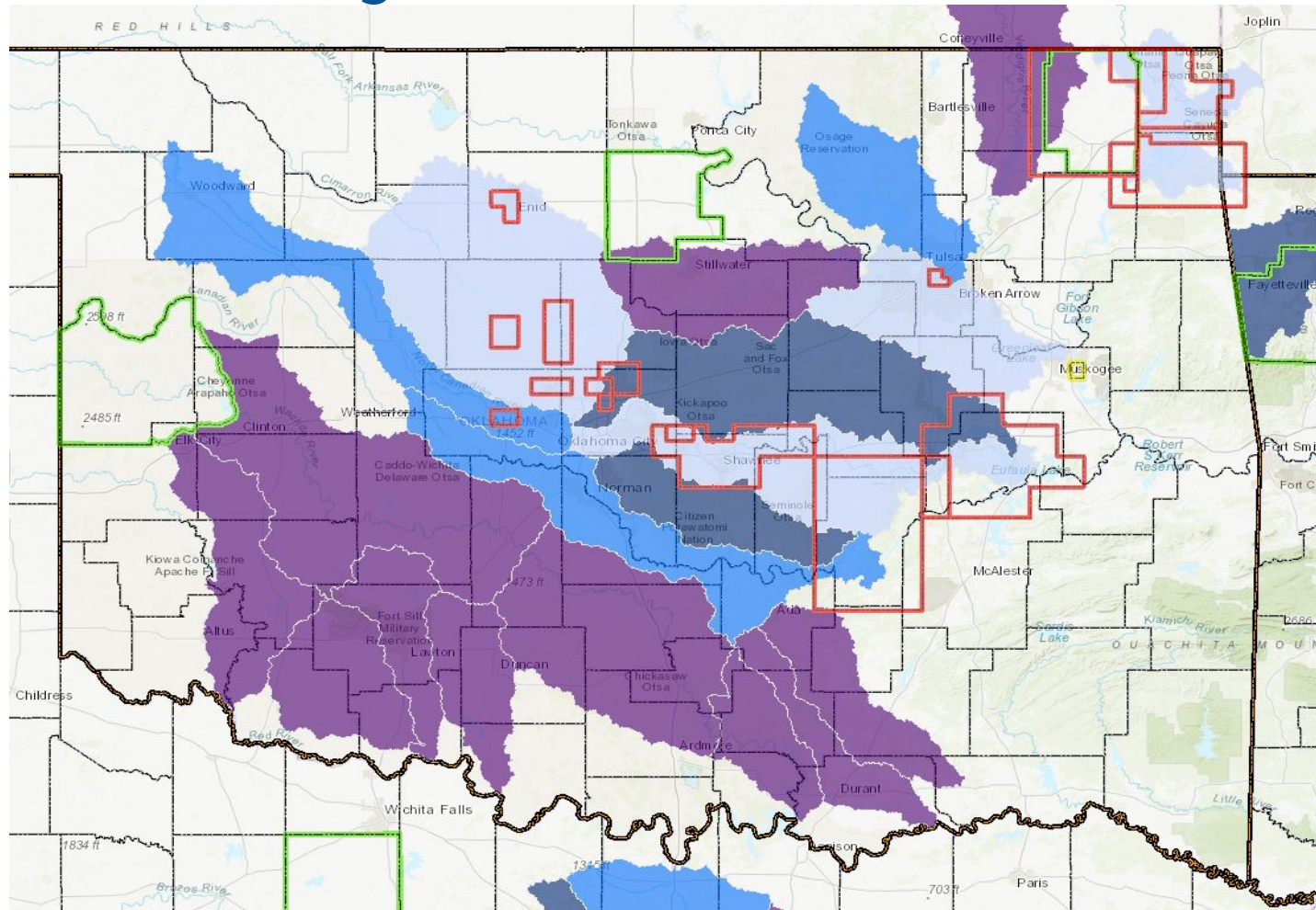
CTP Program

Collaboration between federal, state, local, and other stakeholders to maintain up-to-date flood hazard maps and other flood hazard information

- **Prioritize** development of flood risk information for unmapped and under-mapped communities utilizing Base Level Engineering (BLE) and other available resources.
- **Increase** outreach by targeting communities with completed Base Level Engineering (BLE) studies. Use opportunity to develop project plans – including map adoption, future studies and mitigation actions.
- **Expand** Model Backed Mapping to all NFIP participating communities. Leverage completed BLE's to identify high risk of flooding.
