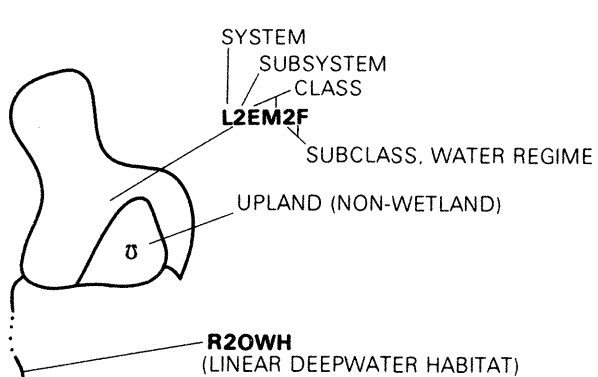


This document was prepared primarily by stereoscopic analysis of high altitude aerial photographs. Wetlands were identified on the photographs based on vegetation, visible hydrology, and geography in accordance with *Classification of Wetlands and Deepwater Habitats* (FWS/OBS - 79/31 December 1979). The aerial photographs typically reflect conditions during the specific year and season when they were taken. In addition, there is a possibility of error in the use of the aerial photographs. Thus, a detailed ground-based survey and analysis of a single site may result in a revision of the wetland boundaries established through photographic interpretation. In addition, some small wetlands and those not covered by dense forest cover may not be included on this document.

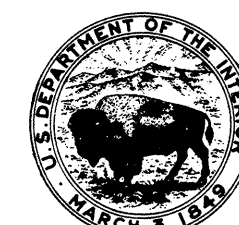

 - This map uses the class Unconsolidated Shore (US). On earlier NWI maps that class was designated Beach/Bar (BB), or Flat (FL). Subclasses remain the same in both versions.
