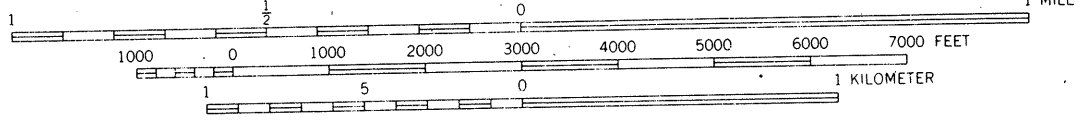


NATIONAL WETLANDS INVENTORY

This document was prepared primarily by stereoscopic analysis of high altitude aerial photographs. Wetlands were identified on the photographs based on vegetation, hydrology, and other features. The following are the **Classified** **Wetlands and Deep-Water Habitats of the United States** (An Operational Draft). Cowardin, et al. 1977. The aerial photographs typically reflect conditions during one specific year and season when they were taken. In addition, there is a possibility of error inherent in the use of the aerial photographs. Thus, a detailed on the ground and historical analysis of a single site may result in a revision of the wetland boundaries established through the use of the aerial photographs. Thus, small wetlands and those obscured by dense forest cover may not be included in this document.

Federal, State and local regulatory agencies with jurisdiction over wetlands may define and describe wetlands in a different manner than that used in this inventory. There is no attempt, in this design or products of this inventory, to define the limits of proprietary jurisdiction of any Federal, State or local government or to establish the geographical scope of the regulatory programs of government agencies. Persons intending to engage in activities involving modifications within or adjacent to wetland areas should seek the advice of appropriate Federal, State or local agencies concerning specified agency regulatory programs and proprietary jurisdictions that may affect such activities.
