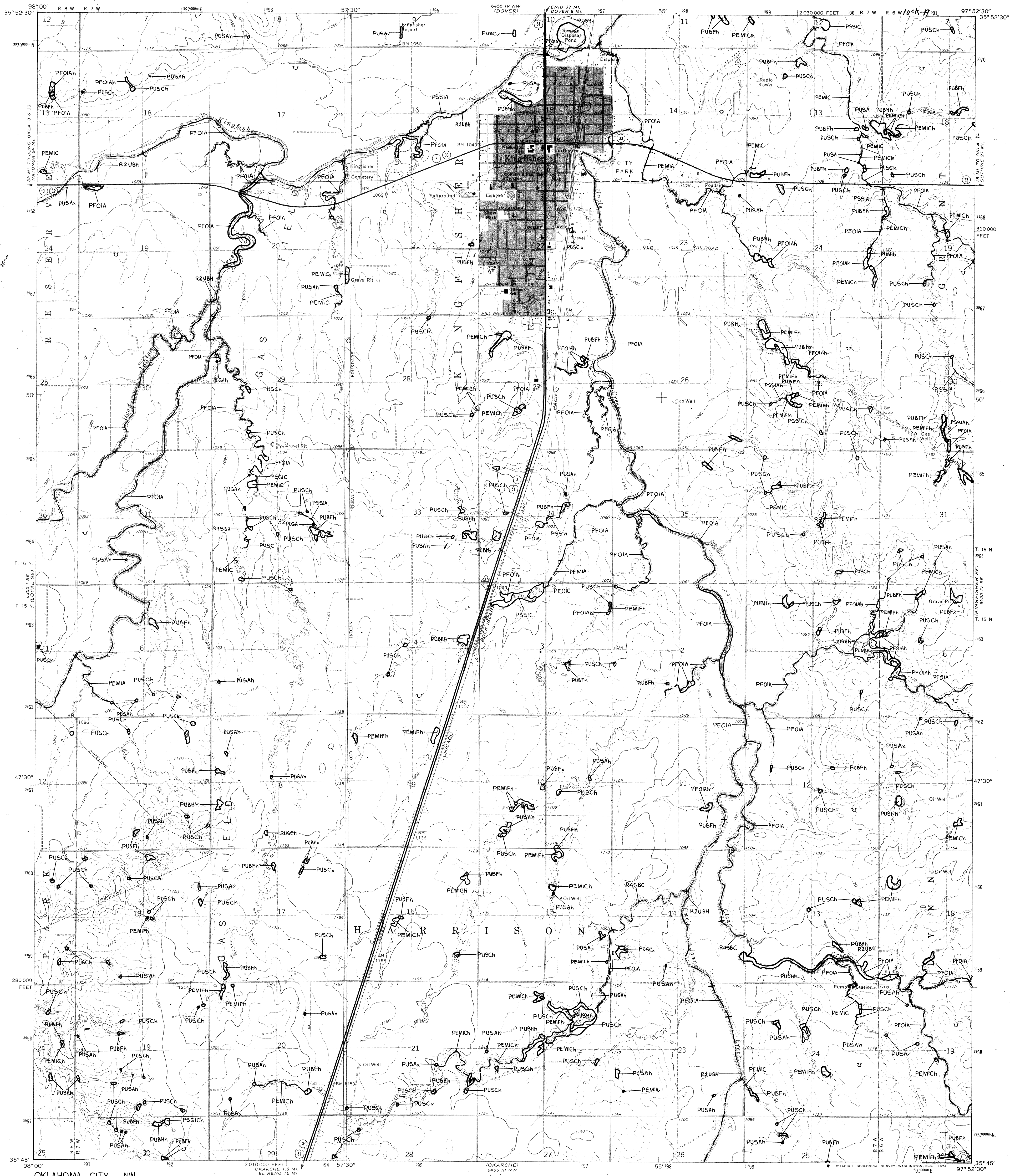
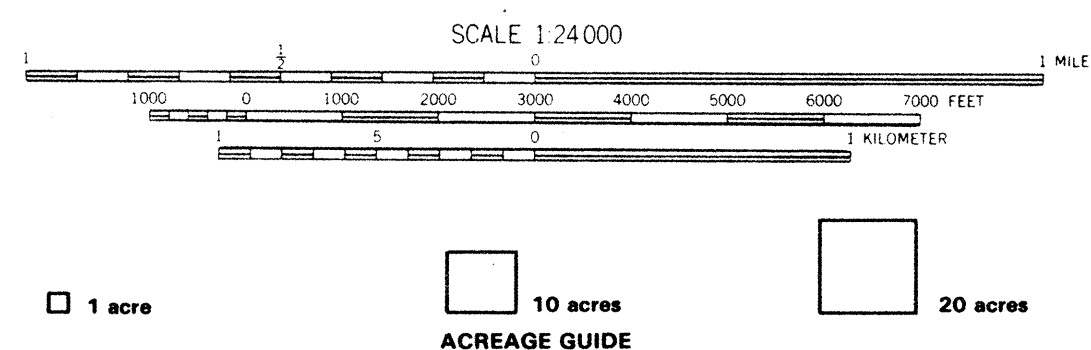

SPECIAL NOTE

This document was prepared primarily by stereoscopic analysis of high altitude aerial photographs. Wetlands were identified on the photographs based on vegetation, visible water, and other features. The study was conducted under the auspices of the **United States Fish and Wildlife Service, Wetland Inventory and Assessment Program, National Wetland Inventory, and the National Wetland Inventory of Wetlands and Deepwater Habitats of the United States (FWS/OBS - 79/31 December 1979).** The aerial photographs typically reflect conditions during the specific year and season when they were taken. In addition, there are many factors that can affect the accuracy of aerial photographs. Thus, a detailed on the ground and historical analysis of a single site may result in a revision of the wetland boundaries established through photographic analysis. In addition, some small wetlands and those obscured by dense forest cover may not be included on this document.

Federal, State and local regulatory agencies with jurisdiction over wetlands may define and describe wetlands in a different manner than that used in this inventory. There is no attempt, in either the design or products of this inventory, to define the limits of proprietary jurisdiction of any Federal, State or local government or to establish the geographical scope of the regulatory programs of government agencies. Persons intending to engage in activities involving wetlands, or persons wishing to add to wetlands, should seek the advice of appropriate Federal, State or local agencies concerning specified agency regulatory programs and proprietary jurisdictions that may affect such activities.

- Some areas designated as RASB, R4SBW, or R4SBJ (INTERMITTENT STREAMS) may not meet the definition of wetland.
- This map uses the class Unconsolidated Shore (US). On the original NWI maps that class was designated Beach/Bar (BB), or Flat (FL). Subclasses remain the same in both versions.
