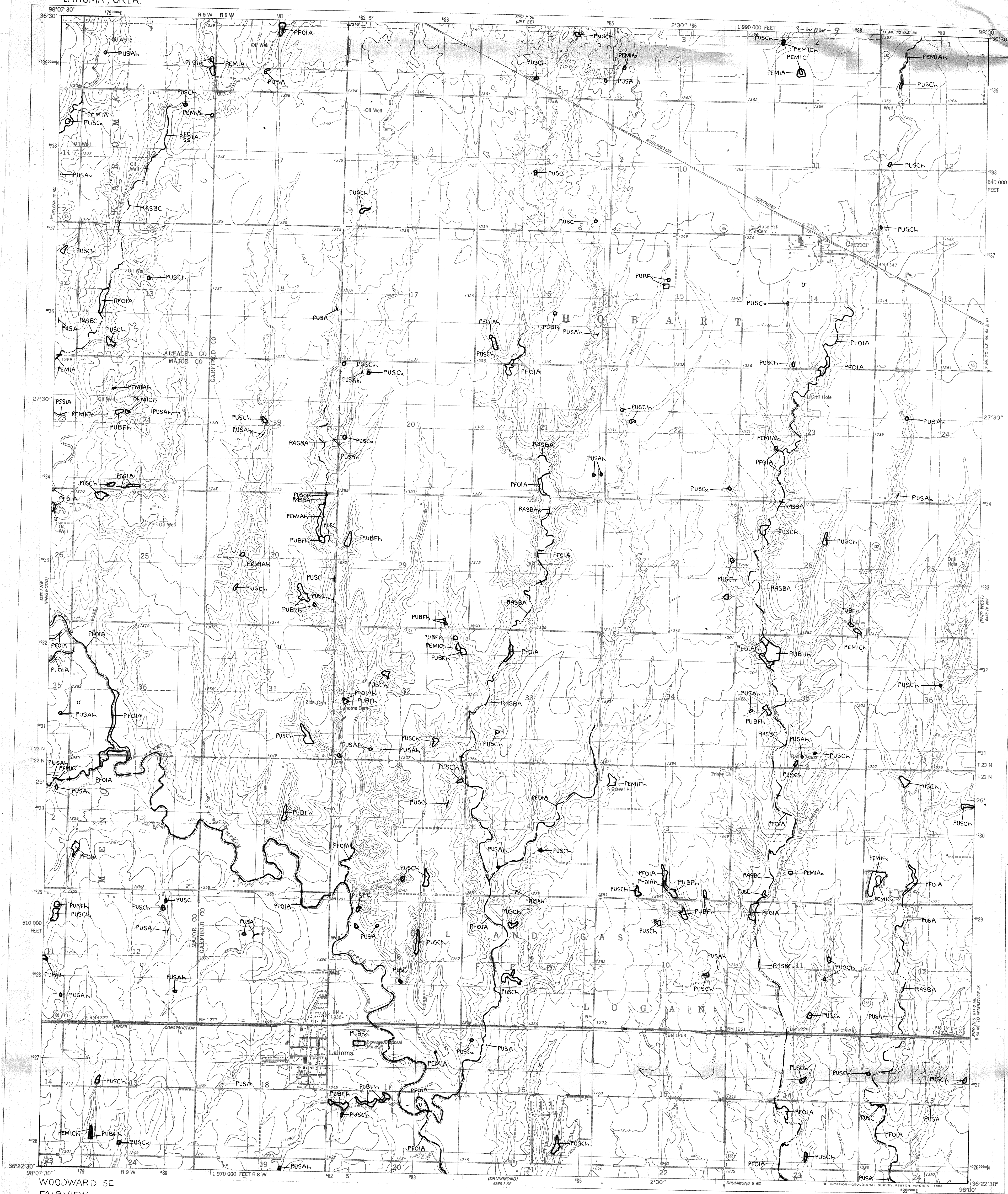

SPECIAL NOTE This document was prepared primarily by stereoscopic analysis of high altitude aerial photographs. Wetlands were identified on the photographs based on vegetation, visible hydrology, and geography in accordance with **Classification of Wetlands and Deepwater Habitats of the United States** (SRS - 79.31 December 1979). The aerial photographs typically reflect conditions during a specific year and season when they were taken. In addition, there is a margin of error inherent in the use of the aerial photographs. Thus, a detail on the ground and historical analysis of a single site may result in a revision of the interpretation established through photographic interpretation. In addition, some small wetlands and those obscured by dense forest cover may not be included on this document.

SYMBOLGY EXAMPLE

- UPLAND (NON-WETLAND)**: A specific subclass within the water regime.
- R2OWH**: A specific subclass within the upland (non-wetland) category.
- (LINEAR DEEPWATER HABITAT)**: A specific subclass within the R2OWH category.

- Wetlands which have been field examined are indicated on the map by an asterisk (*).
- Additions or corrections to the wetlands information displayed on this map are solicited. Please forward such information to the address indicated.
- Subsystems, Classes, Subclasses, and Water Regimes in *italics* were developed specifically for NATIONAL WETLANDS INVENTORY mapping.
- Some areas designated as R4SB, R4SBW, or R4SBJ (INTERNET STREAMS) may not meet the definition of wetland.
- This map uses the class Unconsolidated Shore (US). On earlier NWI maps that class was designated Beach/Bar (B) or, Flat (FL). Subclasses remain the same in both years.
