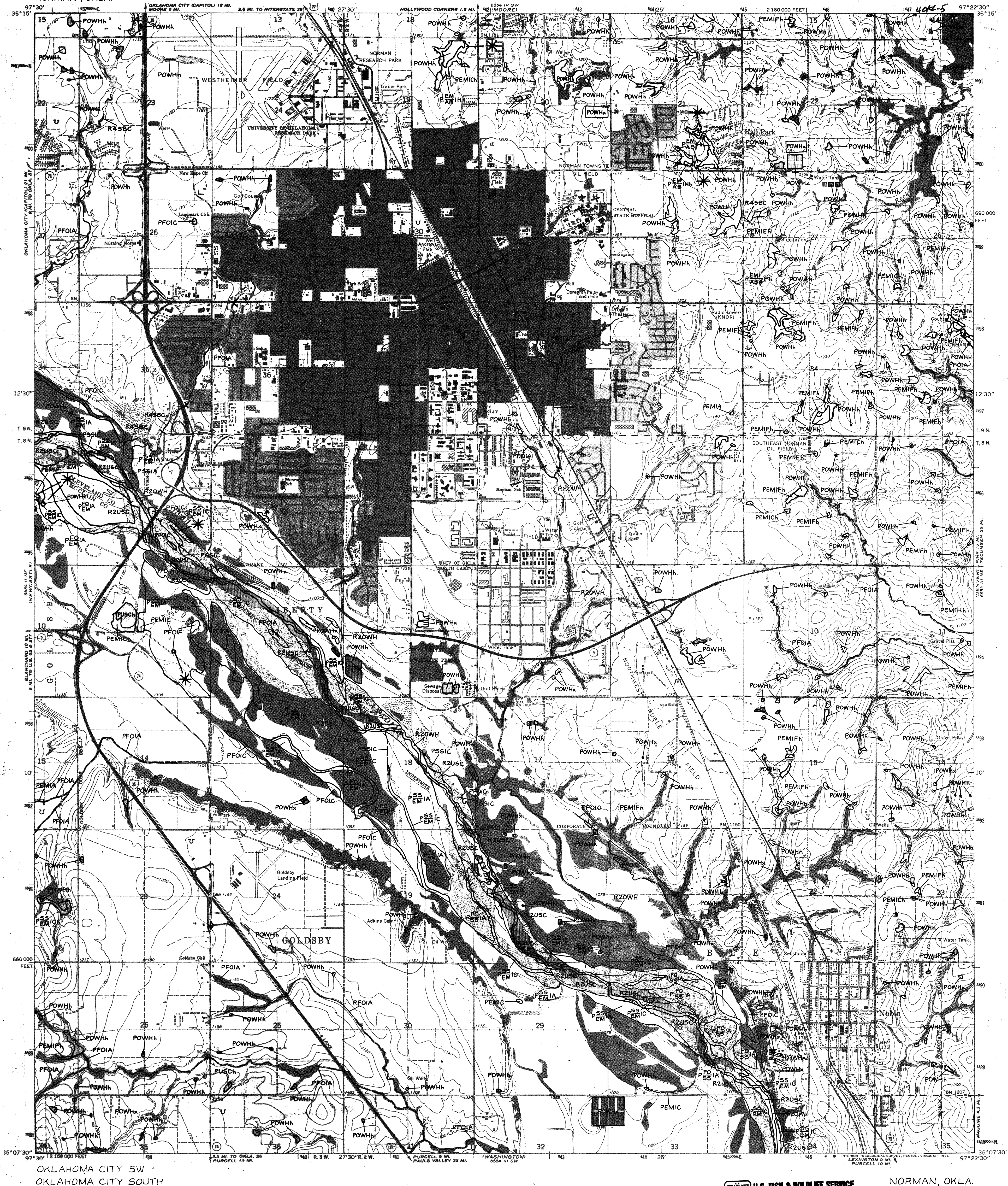

SPECIAL NOTE

This document was prepared primarily by stereoscopic analysis of high altitude aerial photographs. Wetlands were identified on the photographs based on vegetation, visible water, and other features. The title of this report is a revision of Wetlands and Deep-Water Habitats of the United States (An Operational Draft), Cowardin, et al. 1977. The aerial photographs typically reflect conditions during the specific year and season when they were taken. In addition, the aerial photographs may not be of the same scale as the aerial photographs. Thus, a detailed on the ground and historical analysis of a single site may result in a revision of the wetland boundaries established through photographic interpretation. In addition, some small wetlands and those obscured by dense forest cover may not be included on this document.

Federal, State and local regulatory agencies with jurisdiction over wetlands may define and describe wetlands in a different manner than that used in this inventory. There is no attempt, in either the design or products of this inventory, to define the limits of proprietary jurisdiction of any Federal, State or local government or to establish the geographical scope of the regulatory programs of government agencies. 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The flowchart illustrates the hierarchy of the Wetland Classification System. It starts with the 'SYSTEM' at the top, which branches into 'SUBSYSTEM', 'CLASS', and 'E2EM5N'. 'SUBSYSTEM' and 'CLASS' both lead to 'E2EM5N'. From 'E2EM5N', the path leads to 'SUBCLASS, WATER REGIME', which then branches into 'UPLAND (NON-WETLANDS)' and 'Pf or Pkf FARMED WETLANDS
CONTROLLED WATER REGIM'.

- Dominance type (either vegetative or sedentary animal) can be added to the map by the interested user.

- Some areas designated R4SB, R4SBW, or R4SBJ (intermittent streams) may not meet the definition of wetlands.
