SPECIAL NOTE This document was prepared primarily by stereoscopic analysis of high altitude aerial photographs. Wetlands were identified from aerial photographs based on vegetation, visible hydrology, and geography in accordance with **Classification of Wetlands and Deepwater Habitats** (December 1979). The aerial photographs typically reflect conditions during the specific year and season when they were taken. The use of the aerial photographs. Thus, a detailed on the ground and historical analysis of a single site may result in a more accurate photographic interpretation. In addition, some small wetlands and those obscured by dense forest cover may not be included on this map.

Federal, State and local regulatory agencies with jurisdiction over wetlands may define and describe wetlands in a manner that differs from the criteria used in this map. There is no attempt, in either the design or products of this inventory, to define the limits of proprietary jurisdiction of any governmental agency. The map is intended to provide a geographical scope of the regulatory programs of government agencies. Persons intending to engage in activities that may affect wetlands should consult the appropriate Federal, State or local agencies concerning specified agency regulatory jurisdiction. Proprietary jurisdictions that may affect such activities.

This document was prepared primarily by stereoscopic analysis of high altitude aerial photographs. Wetlands were identified on the basis of vegetation, soil, and hydrology, and geography in accordance with **Classification of Wetlands and Deepwater Habitats of the United States (FWS/OBS - 79/31 December 1979)**. The hydrology and geography were determined during the specific year and season when they were taken. In addition, there is a margin of error inherent in the use of the aerial photographs. The use of aerial photographs for the analysis of a single site may result in a revision of the wetland boundaries established through photographic interpretation. In addition, some forest cover may not be included on this document.

Federal, State and local regulatory agencies with jurisdiction over the wetlands should examine and describe wetlands in a different manner than that used in this inventory. There is no attempt, in either the design or products of this inventory, to depict the wetlands in a manner that would be used by the State or local government or to establish the geographical scope of the regulatory programs of government agencies. Persons intending to regulate the wetlands areas should seek the advice of appropriate Federal, State or local agencies concerning specified agency regulatory jurisdiction over proprietary jurisdictions that may affect such activities.
