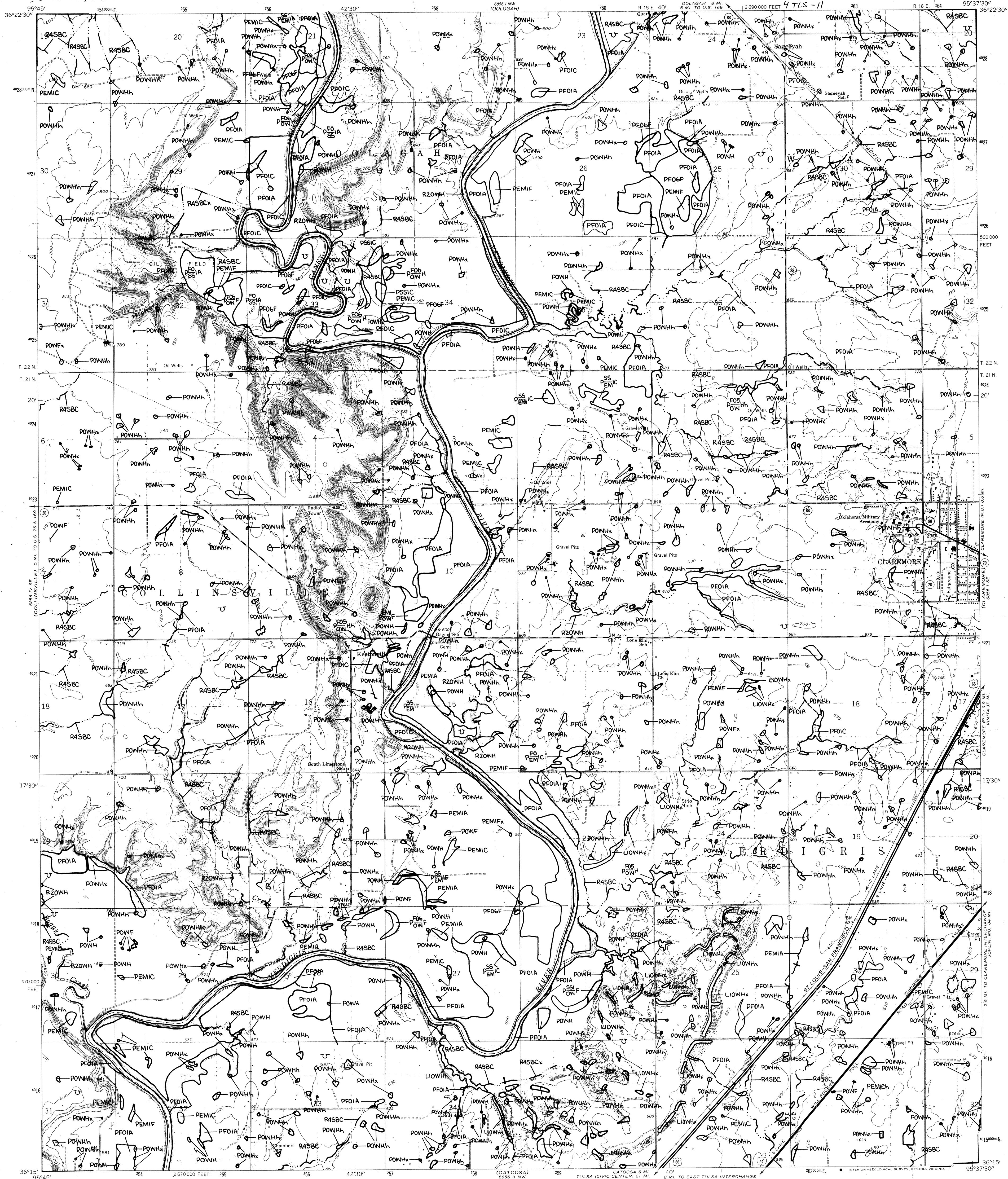

SPECIAL NOTE

This document was prepared primarily by stereoscopic analysis of high altitude aerial photographs. Wetlands were identified on the photographs as bare, vegetated, or wooded areas. The analysis was done in accordance with *Classification of Wetlands and Deep-Water Habitats of the United States* (An Operational Draft), Cowardin, et al, 1977. The aerial photographs typically reflect conditions during the summer months, in season where they were taken. In addition, there is a margin of error inherent in the use of the aerial photographs. Thus, a detailed on the ground and historical analysis of a single site may result in a revision of the wetland boundaries established through photographic interpretation. Areas of uncertainty or doubt may be obscured by dense forest cover may not be taken into this document.

Federal, State and local regulatory agencies with jurisdiction over wetlands may define and describe wetlands in a different manner than that used in this inventory. There is no attempt, in either the design or products of this inventory, to define the limits of proprietary jurisdiction. Federal, State or local agencies may wish to establish the geographic scope of the regulatory programs of governmental agencies. Persons intending to engage in activities involving modifications within or adjacent to wetland areas should seek the advice of appropriate Federal, State or local agencies concerning specified agency regulatory programs.

The flowchart illustrates the Wetland Classification System (E2EM5N). It begins with the 'SYSTEM' level, which leads to the 'SUBSYSTEM CLASS' level. From the 'SUBSYSTEM CLASS' level, the classification proceeds to the 'E2EM5N' level. This level then branches into two main categories: 'SUBCLASS, WATER REGIME' and 'UPLAND (NON-WETLANDS)'. The 'SUBCLASS, WATER REGIME' category further branches into 'Pf or Pkf FARMED WETLANDS' and 'CONTROLLED WATER REGIM'.

- Wetlands which have been field examined are indicated on the map by an asterisk (*).
- Dominance type (either vegetative or sedentary animal) can be added to the map by the interested user.

- Some areas designated R4SB, R4SBW, or R4SBJ (intermittent streams) may not meet the definition of wetlands.
