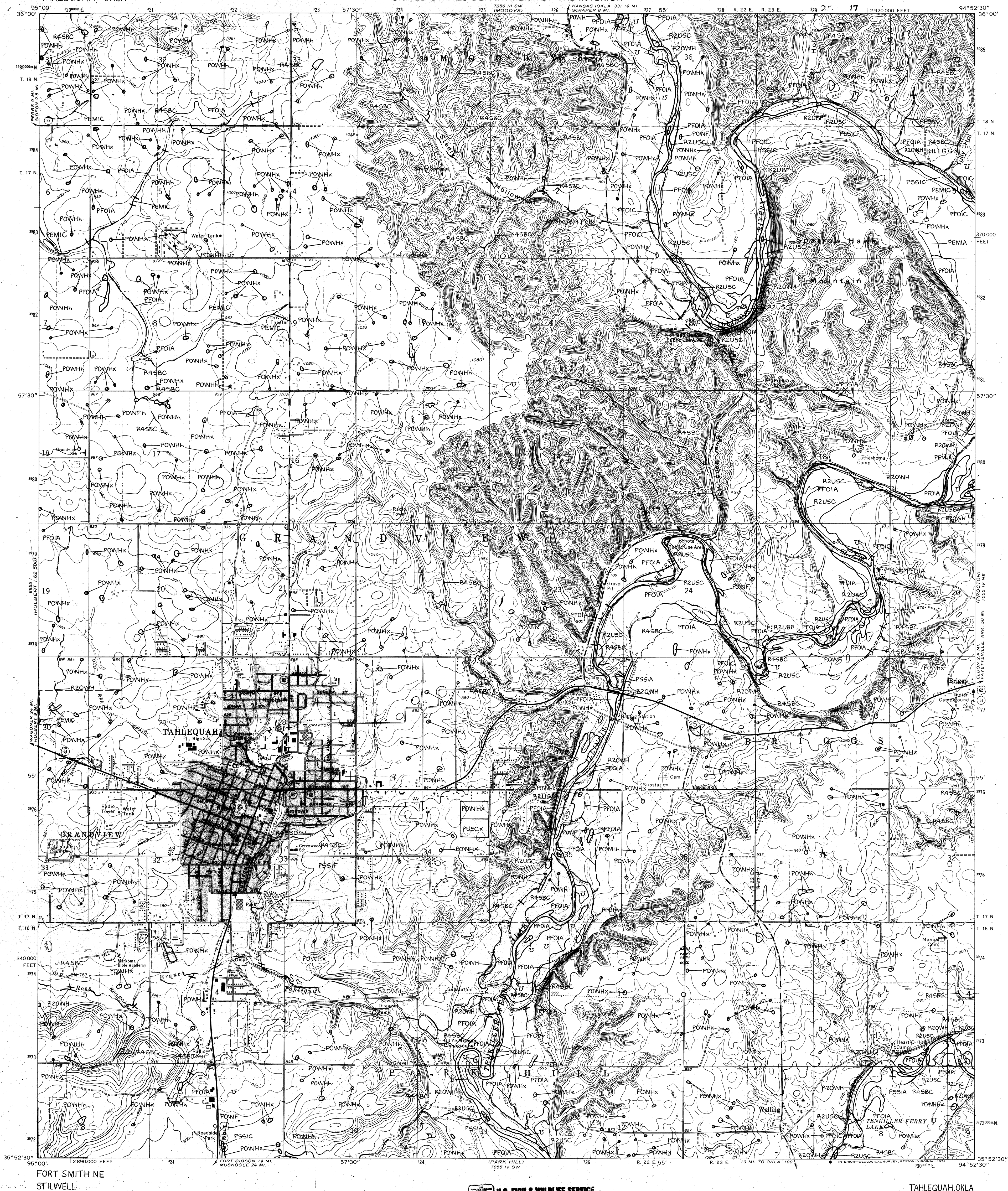

SPECIAL NOTE

This document was prepared primarily by stereoscopic analysis of high altitude aerial photographs. Wetlands were identified on the photographs based on vegetation, visible water, and geology in accordance with Classification of Wetlands and Deep-Water Habitats of the United States (An Operational Draft), Cowardin, et al, 1977. The aerial photographs typically reflect conditions during the specific year and season when they were taken. In addition, there is a margin of error inherent in the use of the aerial photographs. Thus, a detailed on the ground and historical analysis of a single site may reveal different wetland boundaries established through photographic interpretation. In addition, some small wetlands and those obscured by dense forest cover may not be included on this document.

Federal, State and local regulatory agencies with jurisdiction over wetlands may define and describe wetlands in a different manner than that used in this inventory. There is no attempt, in either the design or products of this inventory, to define the limits of proprietary jurisdiction of any Federal, State or local government or to establish the geographical scope of the regulatory programs of government agencies. The flowchart illustrates the Wetland Classification System (E2EM5N). It starts with the SYSTEM, which branches into the SUBSYSTEM. The SUBSYSTEM further branches into the CLASS. The CLASS then branches into E2EM5N. E2EM5N branches into SUBCLASS, WATER REGIME. SUBCLASS, WATER REGIME branches into UPLAND (NON-WETLANDS) and FARMED WETLANDS. FARMED WETLANDS branches into CONTROLLED WATER REGIME and Pf or Pkf.
